She also served as a hostess for the church Home Bible Study. She enjoyed sports. Therefore she played on the women softball team. Her family knew her to be faithful, focused, and committed to the call of Christ. She didn't waiver, but walked a straight and righteous life for Christ. Mish and Stanley remained faithfully committed as one for forty years. They were blessed to have two sons and one God daughter. Audimishel commuted round trip 60 miles from Kenosha to Milwaukee with a friend Marilyn Byrd to and from work. They both left that job and was employed with Milwaukee Public School after having her first child. She was assigned to

teach Middle school children. This was truly her passion and she gave sacrificially to insure that they could and would succeed to advance forward in their studies. She later received her master degree from Cardinal Stritch University of Milwaukee, WI. In case and point Audimishel was a straight "A" student in High School and remained on the Deans list throughout college. She was an avid reader just like her mother. In May 2014 she relocated to Braxton, MS and united with Jerusalem Missionary Baptist Church under the leadership of Pastor Dennis Grant. She was a very willing worker and helped where needed.
