A precious one from us is gone. The voice we loved is still. A place is vacant in our heart which never can be filled. On June 9, 2019, an angelic cook was called to God's Heavenly Kitchen. She passed away peacefully at Brandon Nursing Rehabilitation.

Elease Wright was born August 30, 1927 to the late Sam and Callie Wright in Brandon, Mississippi. Two sisters and five brothers preceded her in death. At an early age, Elease joined the Sandhill Missionary Baptist Church and attended faithfully until her health began to fail.

In the early 1960's Elease turned her love for cooking into a successful business known as Baby Ruth's Café, serving the public for nearly five decades. Baby Ruth's Café was known for delicious soul food dishes, but most famous for her hamburgers. With no telephone nor advertisements, Baby Ruth's Café became a historic icon in Rankin County until 2009. Elease met the love of her life, Willie "Boot" Moore in the 1940's. They were together happily until his death in October 1991.

Cherishing her memory, she leaves a niece/adopted daughter Barbara "Sugar" McAllister of Raymond, Mississippi; a devoted sister, Sarah Andrews of Jackson, Mississippi who served as her caregiver for eight years; three loving sisters, Bobbie Proctor (Earnest), Elizabeth Taylor (Archie) of Brandon, Mississippi; Clara Ann Walker of San Diego, California and one brother Bailey Brown of Brandon, Mississippi; and a host of nieces, nephews, five bosses as she fondly referred to-Teenie, Sugar, Gwen, Sherry, Veedie and many faithful
